The Junior League of Raleigh's financial statements are audited annually. The condensed financial statements presented below are derived from the 2004–2005 audited financial statements prepared by the firm of Boyce, Furr & Company, LLP. A complete copy of such financial statements and auditor's report may be obtained at League headquarters located at 4020 Barrett Drive, Suite 104 in Raleigh or by calling 919-787-7480. In addition, ongoing planning and monitoring of Junior League of Raleigh's income and expenditures are conducted by several in-League volunteer entities. The League's Finance Committee is responsible for advising the Board of Directors and leadership councils on financial matters, assisting in the preparation of the annual budget, examining budgets of proposed projects, reviewing the League's investment portfolio, and reviewing and approving the various reserved funds. Finance Committee members are also designated as liaisons to each Junior League of Raleigh committee. As liaisons, these Finance volunteers serve as information resources on financial matters, assisting committee Chairs in understanding their current year budgets and developing a budget for the next fiscal year. These efforts help assure sound financial management and adherence to the Junior League of Raleigh's fiscal and community service strategies.



# CELEBRATING 75 YEARS OF SERVICE

Not many organizations get the chance to celebrate their 75-year anniversary. Even fewer can say that they have consistently and successfully carried out the objectives of their original mission throughout each one of their 75 years.

Then again, not every organization has the dedication and spirit of the Junior League of Raleigh. From the beginning, the League has worked hard to serve the needs of the community through the effective action of trained volunteers. And after 75 years of leadership, the League and our community have a lot to celebrate.

What began with 22 members back in the early days of the Depression has evolved to include 679 active members, 841 sustainer members and 120 provisional members. Since 1930, the League has contributed more than 1,000,000 volunteer hours and nearly \$4,500,000 to community projects and programs focusing on education, health and family services. In 2004–2005, the League provided leadership, training opportunities and community service through 12 community teams and 22 funding, planning and membership teams targeting promising youth.

The Junior League of Raleigh's volunteers and financial resources have improved the quality of life for countless children and families in our community throughout the years. It's easy to see why the Junior League works so hard to promote effective volunteer action. First-year provisionals, active members and long-time sustainers alike know that behind each one of these initiatives are individuals who find in the Junior League the encouragement to succeed at school, the support to overcome abuse and the courage to build a better life.

## And the award goes to...

What better way to celebrate 75 years than to honor and provide financial support to programs in which the League has had significant involvement? This year, SAFEchild and Playspace were recipients of the First Annual Legacy Awards in recognition of the League's 75th anniversary.

### SAFEchild

It is painful to think there are children suffering from abuse in any community, let alone our own Wake County. The reality is that more than 1,400 children experienced the terror of abuse and neglect in 2004. And those are the children we know about. Many more suffer alone in silence.

The tragedy of child abuse is that it does not have to happen. Preventing child abuse is the vision the Junior League of Raleigh had in 1992 when it dedicated its human and fiscal resources to establish SAFEchild. A Junior League signature project, SAFEchild is the only nonprofit child abuse prevention agency in Wake County. The agency is committed to helping adults and children create nurturing environments free from abuse and neglect.

SAFEchild provides a unique blend of parenting information and social support to families experiencing a variety of situations that put them at risk for child abuse or neglect. Each year more than 600 parents and 7,000 children engage in one or more of SAFEchild's eight child abuse prevention programs. All come to SAFEchild scarred, sad and dispirited—but most leave with hope, skills and new attitudes that make it possible for them to create a nurturing environment. Since 1992, the agency has served more than 15,000 parents and children.

### Playspace

Playspace is a non-profit children's museum in Raleigh dedicated to the education and development of young children through hands-on creative play. The Junior League of Raleigh first provided funding to Playspace in the early 1990s and since that time the Junior League of Raleigh members have served on the board of directors, provided numerous volunteers for the museum and sponsored an Art Room.

Playspace provides a unique and rich environment for young children to learn and grow. The League looks forward to continuing its support of this community treasure through the Legacy Award.

## A star-studded evening

A long-standing tradition, the Junior League has hosted the Inaugural Ball festivities for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and members of the Council of State since 1933. The theme for the festivities this year was "North Carolina Firsts," which highlighted the state's unique firsts—such as the first state-funded art museum, the first public university and the famous first flight in Kitty Hawk in 1903. The two-day event included a luncheon for the First Lady and receptions for the Lieutenant Governor and Governor and a televised Inaugural Gala followed by three simultaneous Inaugural Balls in the Convention and Conference Center.

Countless volunteer hours go into the planning and preparation of the Ball festivities, and the League is proud to help North Carolina honor its newly elected officials. The effect of the Ball is felt by many long after the festivities end. Since the 1930s, the money raised at the Balls has funded Junior League community projects and agencies involved in preventing child abuse, improving public schools, establishing community centers and meeting the needs of the sick, poor and homeless in our community and throughout North Carolina.

## **The 20th Anniversary Shopping SPREE!**

Twenty years ago, a committee of Junior League volunteers brought together 35 vendors of specialty shops and dozens of shoppers eager to get an early start on their Christmas list. The result was the first A Shopping SPREE! and from these modest beginnings, this annual fundraiser has grown into a four-day event that includes more than 110 exhibitors from across the country, 600 volunteers and 10,000 shoppers. A much-anticipated event, A Shopping SPREE! provides a unique opportunity to purchase items from a diverse group of specialty shops outside the Triangle, while generating funds to support the community.

To celebrate its 20th anniversary, the League created a new SPREE! logo and increased the show space to provide a better shopping experience for customers. New and returning corporate sponsors and favorite special events included a sparkling Preview Party, a shopper's dream Early Morning Shopping event and a music-filled Happy Hour. Committee members formed a new partnership with Cameron Village, which resulted in a sold-out fashion show with more than 100 guests in attendance.

Shopping, fashion and funds to support our community initiatives. What's not to like?

## **Taking Care of Business**

Team Taking Care of Business (TCOB) expanded the Junior League of Raleigh's ability to reach out to the community. Created in anticipation of the Center for Community Leadership, Team TCOB provides consulting services to community agencies tailored to the agency's specific needs. This year, Team TCOB worked with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Wake County to address the need to effectively manage and retain volunteers.

After working closely with the Boys and Girls Clubs to provide expertise and training, Team TCOB provided a free training seminar to non-profit agency leaders throughout the Triangle. Together with the League's Quick Impact Team, Team TCOB is able to provide a variety of administrative assistance, strategic expertise and targeted training to non-profit agencies and community partners.

## **Letting nature take center stage**

Each year, the Junior League of Raleigh sends more than 30 volunteers to work with children at the Heritage Park Community Learning Center. Since the League's adoption of the Community Learning Center in 2001, these volunteers have provided educational and emotional support to children from preschool age to adolescence through programs like the Bringing Up Your Grades (BUG) Club and collaboration with the Project Enlightenment On the Road to Reading program.

# HTER FUTURE, STEP AT A TIME

But textbooks and classrooms are only one part of the educational equation. Children also need a place to learn through imagination, exploration and teamwork. A place where they can learn through doing instead of hearing. Where they can make their own connections, at their own pace.

That's the idea behind the Natural Learning Initiative (NLI) at Heritage Park. In conjunction with the North Carolina State University School of Design and the Raleigh Housing Authority, the Natural Learning Initiative is an outdoor learning facility that will include edible gardens and mazes, nature paths and an outdoor theatre stage.

Initiated in 2002, the outdoor museum was carefully planned and designed to encourage creativity, environmental stewardship and cooperation. Back then it took a lot of vision to imagine how the wet, swampy area chosen as the location would become lush greenways overflowing with flowers, fountains and bird watching stations. That vision began to take shape last year as the area was graded, pathways cut, and concrete sidewalks, drainage pipes and electrical conduits added. In 2004–2005, the League turned its attention to landscaping and beautifying this ready canvas.

## A time to plant

As any gardener knows, there's nothing more exhilarating—or daunting—than a blank patch of earth. Especially when that patch of earth will be used and explored by children from the entire community. Thanks to a grant from NC Beautiful, the task of landscaping the NLI got a little bit easier. In the fall of 2004, more than 30 volunteers and children of Heritage Park—along with volunteers from community partner Starbucks—helped plant, water and mulch 100 azaleas at the NLI project area. Junior League volunteers returned again in the spring and, working together with the children of Heritage Park, planted hostas, daylilies and other perennials.

Children of Heritage Park had another chance to shine with the completion of more than 75 stepping stones for the outside spaces at the complex. The children sketched out ideas drawn from magazines and then brought them to life—from butterfly shapes to mosaic stained glass and hand-painted scenes. These stepping stones will be a reminder of the children and the Junior League volunteers who worked together to create something beautiful from a blank patch of earth.★
