The Junior League of Raleigh experienced tremendous growth and change during the 2009-2010 League year. We celebrated 80 years of service to our community, hosted the 25th Annual A Shopping SPREE!, launched a new cookbook, "*You're Invited Back*," and saw the renovation of and the move into our new home at 711 Hillsborough Street where we began to welcome the community to our Center for Community Leadership.

The 2009-2010 Board and Leadership Council served as good stewards of the needs of our members, the needs of our community and the finances of the League. Our existing community projects took on greater significance as the economy increased the number of clients at our partner agencies and deepened community needs generally. To address the new economic challenges, our League also worked to help provide additional training to our community partners and our members to increase power of our combined knowledge and skills. The 2009-2010 Board and Leadership Council sharpened their focus on the League's finances, working to emphasize fiscal responsibility and fiscal focus in a changed and challenging climate for charitable giving and fundraising.

The positive impact of the League is clear:

- We gave \$25,015 in Community Grants to agencies that serve promising youth in Wake County.
- Our members contributed more than 30,000 hours of community service to agencies in Wake County and to the League itself, the equivalent of \$604,800.
- A record number of women indicated an interest in joining the League, resulting in a Provisional class of 166 women and a waiting list of women who began their Provisional class in 2010-2011.
- The Capital Leadership Initiative, a leadership development program for League members, accepted applications for its inaugural class.
- Through Community Connect, the League provided quarterly training sessions that were free to members of our League and nonprofits in our community.
- The Center for Community Leadership, our new home, opened its doors and began to fulfill the League's goal of providing much needed, affordable meeting space for nonprofits and a centrally located, affordable meeting venue for other companies and entities in our community.

The Junior League of Raleigh has accomplished all this and so much more this year. Our successes are a result of the commitment of time, effort, and the financial support of our members, and the financial support and involvement of our community.

A New Home and a New Resource for our Community: 711 Hillsborough Street The Junior League of Raleigh's Center for Community Leadership



In 2001, the Junior League of Raleigh asked our community partners about their needs and a recurring theme was a need for accessible meeting space. The following year, the membership voted to pursue a new space that would become the League's new home, as well a community crossroads where League members and community advocates could come together to spark change.

After consideration of several other buildings, the League purchased the 28,000-square-foot building leased by the Capitol Broadcasting Company at 711 Hillsborough Street in 2007. Centrally located, on the bus line and in the heart of the ever-growing downtown Raleigh, the new location was close to community partners and the agencies

that need these training facilities the most.

In June 2009, the League began extensive interior renovations to the building, reconfiguring it to suit the needs of a training facility and headquarters. In March 2010, the renovations to the building were complete, and the League moved into the new space.



The League occupies the building's ground floor, which provides four times more space than the Barrett Drive headquarters. The Center boasts a 196-person capacity training room, boardroom, numerous meeting rooms, volunteer workrooms, a living room, catering kitchen, children's playroom and JLR administrative offices, in addition

to ample parking. This additional space gives the League the ability to have many different committee meetings at the same time.

The Center for Community Leadership's first floor meeting rooms were available for rent to community agencies, other nonprofits and local businesses in summer of 2010. The space on the first floor is also available to rent for special events.

The second floor is available for lease, and the Junior League of Raleigh is actively seeking a tenant or tenants for the space on the second floor.

The Junior League of Raleigh's financial statements are audited annually. The condensed financial statement presented here is from the 2009-2010 audited financial statements prepared by the firm or Boyce, Furr & Company, LLP. A complete copy of such financial statements and auditor's report may be obtained at League headquarters located at 711 Hillsborough Street in Raleigh or by calling 919-787-7480. In addition, ongoing planning and monitoring of the Junior League of Raleigh's income and expenditures are conducted by several in-League volunteer entities. The League's Finance Committee is responsible for advising the Board of Directors and leadership councils on financial matters, assisting in the preparation of the annual budget, examining budgets of proposed projects, reviewing the League's investment portfolio and reviewing and approving the various reserved funds. Finance Committee members are also designated as liaisons to each Junior League of Raleigh team. As liaisons, these Finance Committee members serve as information resources on financial matters, assisting team leaders in understanding their current year budgets and developing a budget for the next fiscal year. These efforts help assure sound financial management and adherence to the Junior League of Raleigh's fiscal and community service strategies.


The Junior League of Raleigh uses member-planned and member-run fundraisers to support the projects and programs of the League.
