JLR Serves

The Junior League of Raleigh provides passionate, trained volunteers to local nonprofit efforts, including: AventWest Children's Mentoring, Backpack Buddies, Brentwood Boys & Girls Club, Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina, The Green Chair Project, Helping Horse Therapeutic Riding Program, Heritage Park Community Learning Center, InterAct, Note In The Pocket, SAFEchild and StepUp Ministry.

Note in the Pocket

Note in the Pocket volunteers organized several drive-thru drop-off events, filling a 10-foot U-Haul truck and eight SUVs during their August 2020 drive, raising 3,300 pounds of donations in December and the Women of Color Affinity Group partnered with the community team to ensure success.

While difficult to coordinate volunteer activities during a pandemic, Co-Captain Shanna Stephenson mentioned precautions they have taken to ensure the community partner still gets what it needs.

She said: "the team has been vigilant about staying abreast of the latest Covid protocols. This includes using a larger loaned location to allow for more space between volunteers, quarantine periods for incoming donations before volunteer processing, mask and hand sanitizer restrictions, and smaller volunteer groups."



BackPack Buddies and Brentwood Boys & Girls Club

These programs partnered to support 55 families of the Boys & Girls Club with donations of food.

The JLR Boys & Girls Club Team also made the Brentwood Boys & Girls Club a little brighter this past holiday season. With the usual holiday party on pause, one of the JLR members decorated the club with a donated tree. The festivities also included an outdoor movie (Elf!) for the kids with individual movie candy bags for 55 kids.



InterAct



Our InterAct team traditionally holds a Holiday Bazaar for the women and children of the agency. When that wasn't possible this year, JLR members collected items for 24 women who are currently at the shelter.

The women were given items such as spa facial masks, nail polish/manicure tools, candles, journals and planners, fuzzy socks, shower gels and lotion sets, and perfume.

InterAct is a private, nonprofit, United Way agency that provides safety, support and awareness to victims and survivors of domestic violence and rape/sexual assault.



StepUp Ministry

This year was different for JLR volunteers with StepUp Ministry, but members worked hard to engage kids in a virtual setting, hosting interactive Zoom meetings which included crafts with the kids. For Valentine's Day, JLR volunteers helped the kids make cards for their family members and craft some "Cupid's arrows." Around the end-of-year holidays, JLR members created a gingerbread virtual craft.

"(It) was so much fun watching the kids assemble their houses," said Co-captains Hope Homesley and Whitley Gordon.

Food Bank

Since 2016, the JLR has partnered with the Food Bank of Central & Eastern North Carolina to serve a large population of people who struggle to access nutritious and adequate amounts of food.

The JLR team partners with the Food Bank to further its mission of receiving and distributing as much food as possible, by organizing fresh food so that it can be distributed to the community in an efficient and timely manner.

The Food Bank and our JLR volunteers are committed to addressing food insecurity that remains a serious problem in central and eastern North Carolina.



JLR Trains & Engages

The Government Relations and Public Affairs

Our team organized and conducted a phone bank in advance of the 2020 election to encourage Members to vote. The GRAPA team also held a virtual training event with the Wake County Board of Elections.

When asked about the vision for the phone bank, GRAPA team captain Haven Powell said: "I wanted the JLR Members and our community partners to know the importance of their voices being heard in this critical time."

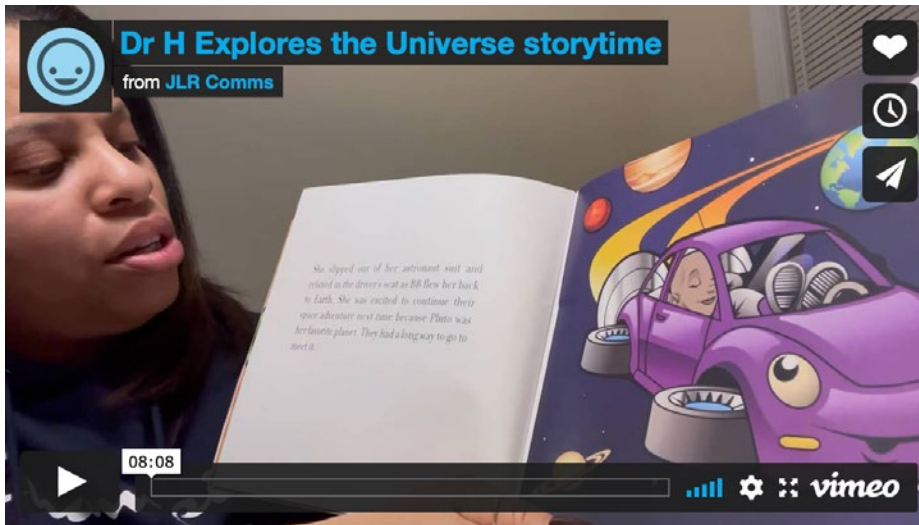

The Women of Color Affinity Group

The Women of Color Affinity Group organized a number of initiatives this year, including partnering with Note in the Pocket and a Black History Month social media series.



The Women of Color Affinity Group also organized, around the National African American Read-In, the nation's first and oldest event dedicated to diversity in literature. As part of our commitment to diversity in literature, the Women of Color Affinity Group hosted a virtual Black History Month Read-In, which included nine virtual storytimes of books with diverse characters.

Military Friends and Family Affinity Group

The Junior League of Raleigh's new Military Friends and Family Affinity Group hosted a card making and letter-writing event on Oct. 25. The group's efforts contributed over 50 cards to be sent to various North Carolina Veteran Administration sites in honor of Veteran's Day!

Discussing the JLR's newest affinity group's founding, Co-Chair Laura Barnes said the idea came about last year when her husband was deployed.

"I was hoping to build connections to others in the League who have been through similar situations and to build community with other members who had another connection to military stories."

One way the Military Families and Friends Affinity Group gives back is through participation in the Wreaths Across America wreath-laying ceremony at the Raleigh National Cemetery.

This event happens annually and honors those who have served our nation. Members of the Military Families and Friends Affinity Group along with their friends and family assisted in laying the wreaths on the headstones at the Raleigh National Cemetery.





SAFEchild

In recognition of Child Abuse Prevention Month in April and in support of our community partner SAFEchild, JLR volunteers planted a pinwheel garden in front of the Junior League of Raleigh building, the Julia Jones Daniels Center for Community Leadership.

Prevent Child Abuse America introduced the Pinwheels for Prevention Campaign in 2008.

According to their website, the pinwheels “represent childlike whimsy and lightheartedness and our vision for a world where all children grow up happy, healthy, and prepared to succeed in supportive families and communities.

Legacy Grants

Four well-deserving Wake County charitable organizations are receiving grants of \$5,000 each during the Junior League of Raleigh's a (virtual) SPREE! The awards were announced and presented live on our Facebook page.

Since its inception in 2004, JLR's Legacy Grant has awarded nonprofit agencies \$260,000 — all made possible by proceeds from A Shopping SPREE!

Team Community Funding carefully reviews all grant applicants that are nominated by League members and selects the recipients the committee feel best support the local community and place an emphasis on children and women. JLR has a long-standing commitment to empowering Wake County women and youth and this year's recipients further that mission through housing, health and education.

2020 Legacy Grant Award Recipients

The Frankie Lemmon School and Developmental Center

Frankie Lemmon School and Developmental Center's mission is to educate and celebrate children of all abilities. The grant award will assist in fulfilling the need for Frankie Lemmon students to receive monthly therapy/educational toolkits to support at home learning and therapy. Preschoolers learn best through hands-on activity and play, which is why it is so critical that children at risk of delays or with developmental delays be given the proper tools to support therapy and learning at home. The toolkits were created as an educational resource during COVID-19 pandemic and will continue to be utilized after COVID-19.

Garner Road Community Center

The Garner Road Community Center practices Christian values to develop the total person in spirit, mind and body through character development programs that empower children, families and communities to achieve lifelong successes. Garner Road Community Center plans to use the grant towards three areas of increased need, brought on by COVID-19: improving technology within the center, providing more wholesome meals and snacks, and increasing transportation to and from the center.

Haven House Services

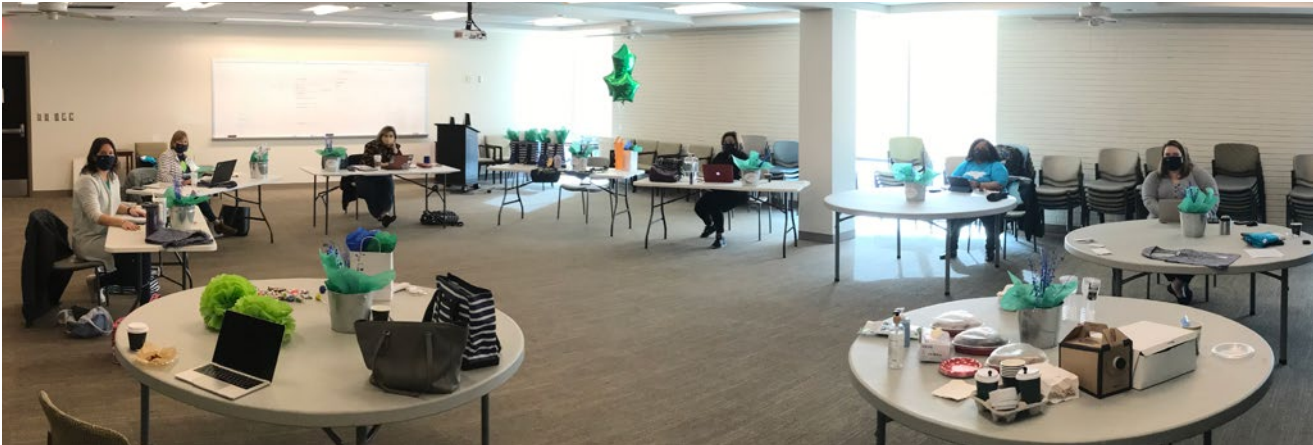
The mission of Haven House Services is to help youth be safe, supported and successful. Haven House helps our community's most vulnerable young people. This includes youth experiencing homelessness, youth in crisis, youth involved or at risk for involvement with the juvenile justice system, and youth having difficulty at school or home. Haven House will use the grant award for program operational expenses incurred due to the increased needs and challenges brought on by COVID-19.



The Women's Center

The mission at The Women's Center is to remedy the cycle of trauma, abuse, violence and homelessness among women in The Triangle, assisting women in achieving self-sufficiency, realizing their dreams of a fulfilling and dignified life. The Women's Center addresses critical needs such as meals, hygiene, clothing, mail services, transportation assistance, and safe, affordable housing. With the Legacy Grant, The Women's Center will increase the number of units in the Integrative Permanent Community Supportive Housing Program and increase the availability of immediate, safe and permanent housing with anonymity for women fleeing domestic violence, interpersonal violence and human trafficking.

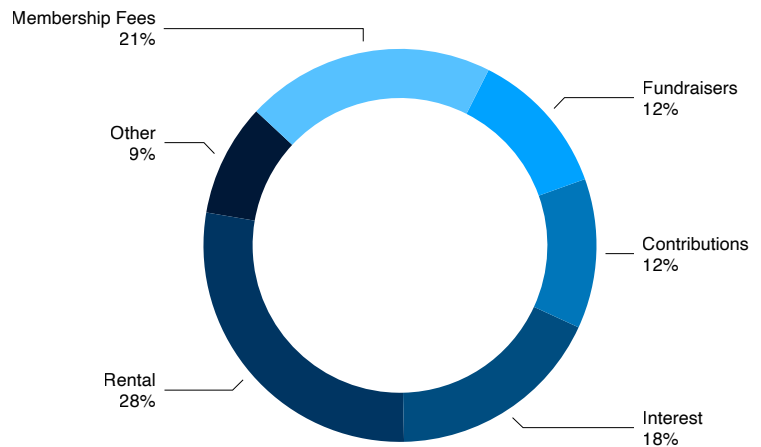

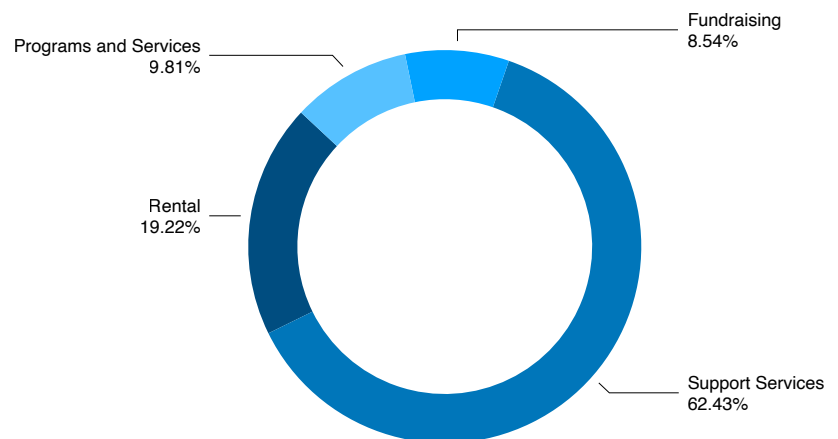
